South London council slammed after demolishing leisure centre and only then finding out building a replacement would go £40m over budget

South London council which knocked down a leisure centre only to discover it didn't have enough money in its current budget to build its replacement has been lammed by a resident for having "no workable plan". Kingston Council is reviewing ptions to replace the Kingfisher Leisure Centre after being told it would cost almost .80million to build the new facility that was granted planning permission in May 2022 nuch higher than the £43.8m it had put aside for it.

he Kingfisher was shut in 2019 after it was decided repairs to fix the roof would cost more han £5m. It was bulldozed in 2023, despite an earlier petition signed by almost 4,000 eople to halt demolition, after the replacement facility won planning permission.

out plans to build a new complex have been delayed after the council got quotes through a tendering process of £79.5m. The procurement process to appoint a contractor for the project was terminated in March this year.
